What will be studied	the history of the emergence and development of peacekeeping activities. Concept, principles, goals and main directions of peacekeeping activities. Modernization of modern peacekeeping policy and its current state. Strategy of Ukraine's participation in peacekeeping activities. Inconsistency of the military and police components of peacekeeping activities.
Why it is interesting / should be studied?	since the beginning of independence, Ukraine has been actively involved in peace support operations, which, today, are not limited to the framework of the UN, but also include OSCE missions, activities within the framework of the NATO Partnership for Peace program, and multinational forces. Ukrainian peacekeeping groups are currently represented in nine international peacekeeping and security operations. Ukraine is the only country among NATO partner states that participated in all major operations and missions of the Alliance.
What you can learn (results)	to know the nature of international peacekeeping cooperation, and the nature of interaction between international actors. Understand the history and dynamics of international security, analyze the features of its provision at the global, regional and national levels, and know the nature and approaches to solving international and internationalized conflicts with the help of peacekeeping activities. Research urgent problems of international relations, regional development, and foreign policy of Ukraine, present research results, and provide relevant recommendations. To analyze the specifics of peacekeeping activities (peacekeeping operations, missions) in support of peace of the UN, OSCE, activities

	within the framework of the program «Partnership for Peace» of NATO and multinational forces, classify them and analyze their effectiveness.
