<p>What you can learn (results)</p>	<p>Public speeches from 7 to 18 minutes, hold the attention of listeners, attract attention with the help of unique techniques, and enrich professional communication skills in both Ukrainian and English languages.</p>
<p>How to use the acquired knowledge and skills (competencies)</p>	<p>Conduct public speeches; analyse the ability of the lecturer/speaker to hold the attention of listeners, and the techniques of using gestures, facial expressions, tone of voice, and apt phrases for manipulation and persuasion. TED Talks are an extremely powerful source of motivation.</p>
