<b>Requirements for starting studies</b>	Basic knowledge of negotiations, conflicts, international relations.
<b>What will be studied</b>	Students develop systematic knowledge of the principles, mechanisms, and specific features of mediation in intercultural and interethnic conflicts, ensure the acquisition of practical skills in conducting negotiation processes and resolving conflicts through mediation and foster the ability to analyse the causes, dynamics, and consequences of conflicts.
<b>Why it is interesting / should be studied?</b>	The application of analytical and critical thinking for the in-depth study of international processes is offered, development of communication and intercultural skills, the ability to conduct professional discussions, moderate

	academic debates, and ensure an effective learning environment; enhancement and consolidation of academic knowledge in the field of international relations and mediation of intercultural conflicts.
<b>What you can learn (results)</b>	The study of the discipline contributes to the formation of students' scientific understanding of the concept and features of negotiations and mediation in general, knowledge and basics of conflict resolution in practical situations. Ability to use information and communication technologies. Ability to analyse international processes in various contexts, including political, security, information, etc. Know and understand the nature and dynamics of international security, understand the features of its provision at the global, regional and national levels, know the nature and approaches to solving international and internationalized conflicts
