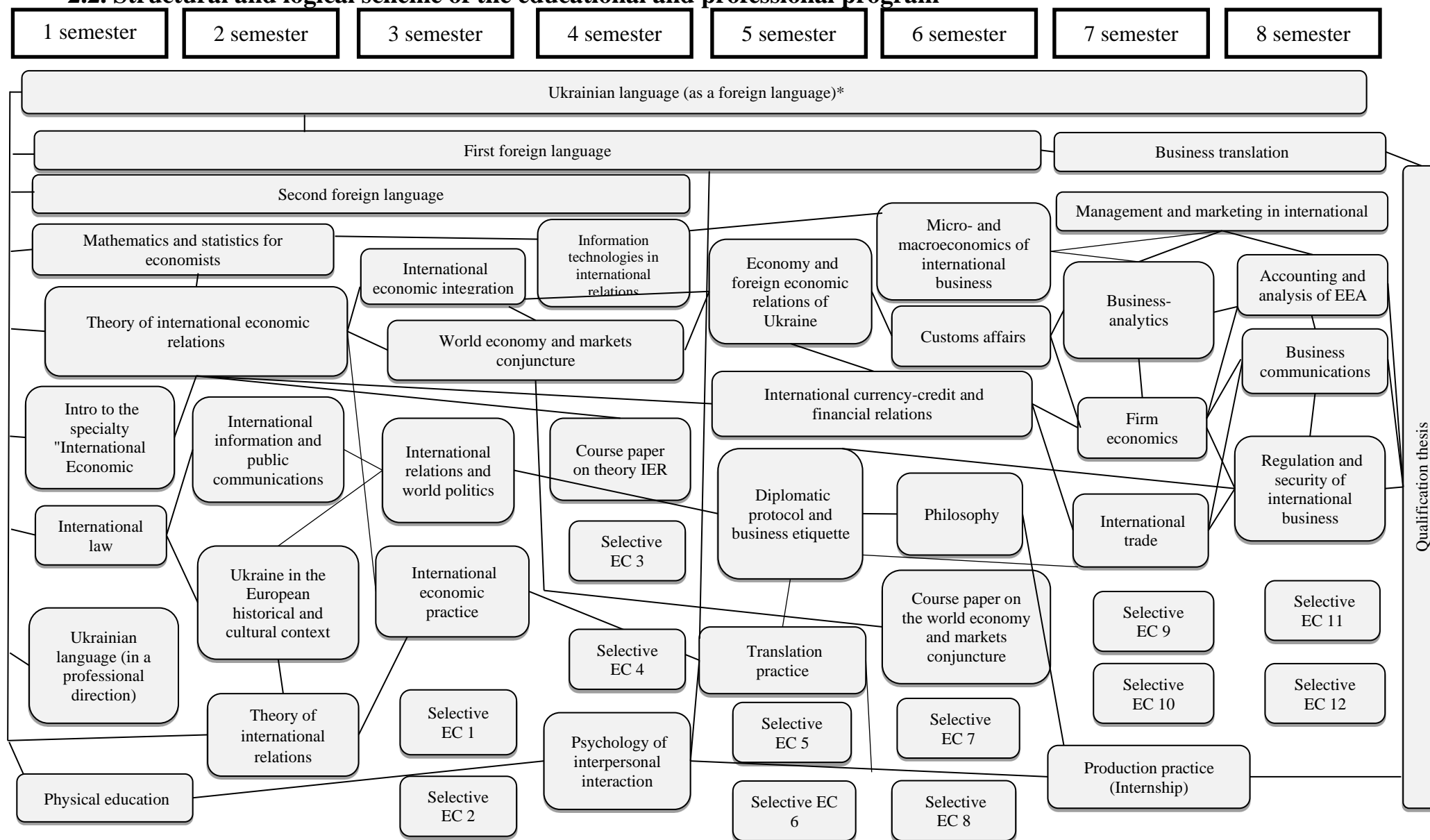

3. Forms of attestation of higher education applicants

Certification of applicants for specialty 292 “International Economic Relations” of the educational program “international business” is carried out in the form of public defense (demonstration) of the qualification work.

Requirements for qualification work: qualification work involves independent solution of a complex task or complex problem in the field of international economic relations, accompanied by research and/or application of innovative approaches and characterized by uncertainty of conditions and requirements. It must meet the requirements of the regulations on final qualification works of 29.06.2022. and regulations on the system of prevention and detection of academic plagiarism in the scientific research activities of applicants for higher education and scientific pedagogical workers of the Lesya Ukrainka VNU dated 26.02.2021. According to the latter, qualified work must be placed in the closed Electronic Fund of qualification works of the University. It can be voluntarily posted by the applicant author in an electronic repository of the Lesya Ukrainka VNU for open access.

Based on the results of certification, a standard document is issued on awarding the applicant a bachelor's degree with an educational qualification – Bachelor of international economic relations and a professional qualification – a specialist in international business with an in-depth knowledge of a foreign language (with language specified).
